AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Cathedral Ordinance of 1902."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Cathedral Ordinance of 1902" THE SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF SYDNEY in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Constitutions for the management and good government of the Church of England within the State of New South Wales and of all other powers vested in the said Synod ordains and rules as follows:—

1. Clauses 6 and 8 of "The Cathedral Ordinance of 1902" are hereby repealed and the following Clauses are substituted therefor and shall be read as Clauses 6 and 8 of the said Ordinance:—

General Government of the Cathedral and Rights of the Archbishop.

6. The general management and government of the Cathedral shall be vested in a body of persons to be called "The Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. Andrew Sydney" without prejudice however to the right of the Archbishop of Sydney to use the Cathedral for Ordinations and on all other occasions appointed by him and to officiate and preach in the Cathedral as he may at any time see fit PROVIDED ALWAYS that in all matters concerning the performance conduct and arrangement of all services in the Cathedral including the appointment of preachers the Archbishop of Sydney shall (subject to any Rules or Regulations made by the Chapter as provided in Clause 15) have and exercise if he so desire full control and authority and his decision shall be final and for such purposes he shall have keys of the Cathedral PROVIDED FURTHER that whenever the See of Sydney shall be vacant the rights powers and privileges vested in the Archbishop under "The Cathedral Ordinance of 1902" and this Ordinance shall be held exercised and enjoyed by the Guardian of the Spiritualities.

Rights of the Dean.

8. Subject to limitations and powers stated in "The Cathedral Ordinance of 1902" and this Ordinance and to the Rules and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder and to the rights and authority of the Archbishop of Sydney which shall be paramount the Dean shall have free access to the Cathedral at all such times as he shall think fit and may celebrate Divine Service administer the Sacraments and perform all other rites and Ordinances of the Church of England within the State of New South Wales therein without any hindrance from any person whomsoever

and shall for such purposes have keys of the Cathedral and he shall freely have use possess and enjoy the Deanery the garden and appurtenances thereof. And in the absence from the Diocese of the Archbishop or at his request the Dean may in so far as he lawfully can so do exercise the rights and powers vested in the Archbishop by Clause 6. PROVIDED that in case he shall cease to hold the office of Dean he shall thereupon *ipso facto* forfeit and be absolutely deprived of all and singular his rights in or respecting the said Cathedral Deanery garden and appurtenances thereof.

2. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Cathedral (Amendment) Ordinance of 1910."
